CCSD 46 Referendum: Get the facts before you vote.

Improvements at ALL seven schools

Approximately half of the proceeds from the voter-approved referendum would address capital facility improvements at each of CCSD 46's school buildings. The District's schools range in age from 16 to 73 years old.

Operating needs addressed

The other half of the proceeds from the voterapproved referendum would address operating needs, benefiting more than 3,500 CCSD 46 students.

Tax Rate Reduced

The tax rate will be reduced because the District is paying off the outstanding bonds that were used to build Park Campus. The tax rate associated with those bonds will end before the new, smaller tax rate goes into effect.

- MAR 14 Vote by Mail application deadline is before 5:00 pm
- MAR 18 Last day for early voting
- MAR 19 General Primary Election day vote at your neighborhood polling location
- MAR 19 Vote by Mail voting deadline: completed ballots must be received at the Lake County Clerk's Office by 7:00 pm on Election Day, March 19, 2024

REGISTRATION FOR 2024-2025 IS NOW OPEN!

Registration for current CCSD 46 students and siblings starting school next year can now complete an Online Registration application in the Infinite Campus Parent Portal by clicking More in the left menu, then Online Registration, and selecting 24-25 Existing Student Registration.

New students (e.g., Kindergarteners) can be added to the Existing Student Registration application. Pre-K students must complete the Early Childhood Screening and qualify for one of the early childhood programs PRIOR to completing the registration application. For more information regarding the Early Childhood program, please contact Sue Hobson at (847) 543-6204. After completing the Online Registration application, the 2024-2025 registration fees can be paid online by clicking on Fees in the left menu. **Early** bird pricing is in effect until May 31!

Please remember that for registration to be complete for the upcoming school year, in addition to the payment of registration fees, the Online Registration application must be submitted and approved. Schedules and transportation assignments will not be released in August until registration is complete.

PARK CAMPUS HOSTS LAKE COUNTY EDUCATORS FEBRUARY 16

On Friday, February 16, CCSD 46 participated in the Lake Country Regional Office of Education Institute Day. Over 1,000 pre-K through 5th grade teachers from around the county attended sessions at Park Campus. The day began with a keynote speaker and was followed by four breakout sessions. Sessions included topics about instructional practices, social-emotional learning, assessments, and technology. The Lake County Regional Office of Education hosted separate sessions on the same day for sixth through twelfth-grade staff at Lakes High School in Lake Villa. CCSD 46 staff that teach those grades attended sessions at that site.
