



### **ELECTRONIC DEVICE DISTRATIONS FOLLOW-UP**

Cell Phone, Smart Watch, and Headphone Expectations: Results of a Staff Survey

Beginning this school year, our school district put new procedures in place regarding student cell phones in grades 5-8. Through this newsletter, school newsletters, and our Student Handbook, we let families know that students in grades 5-8 who bring cell phones to school are required to either secure them in their lockers or check them into storage units in their classrooms at the start of each class. In addition, just like for cell phones, students cannot use smart watches for messages or phone calls during the school day. Also, only wired headphones can be used during the school day because staff members are often unable to detect visually that students are wearing wireless headphones. This allows students to engage in content that distracts them from what is occurring in the classroom. Students who bring wireless headphones to school will be required to keep them secured in their lockers.



Now that we are well into the school year, we conducted a survey of our staff at those grade levels to see how students have acclimated to these changes. We were thrilled with the results!

90% of the respondents said that this school year students "Never" or "Hardly Ever" take cell phones out in class. 82% of the staff members who responded stated that this school year, they "Never" or "Hardly Ever" see disruption due to smartwatches. 86% of the staff members stated that they "Never" or "Hardly Ever" see students disengaged because they are listening to wireless headphones in class.

When asked, "Do you see an improvement in student engagement that you believe is due to the new expectations?", 63% responded, "Yes, a lot!" or "Some."

We wish to thank our families and students for supporting these changes in our schools. We are very glad to see what a difference the changes are making for our learners!

### IMPORTANT CALENDAR INFORMATION



Due to the construction planned at all school buildings during the summer of 2026, the District is beginning the planning process to adjust the school year calendars for the 2025-2026 and 2026-2027 school years.

In order to incorporate an **extra two-week period** into the summer of 2026 for the purpose of completing construction projects, the District plans to **start the 2025-2026 school year one week earlier than usual and start the 2026-2027 school year one week later than usual.**


### PARENTSQUARE COMMUNICATIONS PLATFORM

**GENERAL MEETING: October 16, 2024** 

The CCSD 46 Board of Education held a general meeting on Wednesday, October 16, 2024, in the Falcon Room of Frederick School.

President Stephen Mack called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm. Following the Pledge of Allegiance and the approval of the agenda was the opportunity for public comment. One public comment was made pertaining to the upcoming levy.

Mr. Chris Wildman, Assistant Superintendent of Finance, presented the proposed 2024 Tax Levy, which the Board will vote on at the Regular Board of Education meeting on November 20, 2024.

Board reports were presented as well as the Superintendent report. Board members Jessica Albert and Kristy Miller commented on the success of the Village Harvest event, which was held in collaboration with the Grayslake Area Public Library. Superintendent Glickman expressed gratitude for the success of the Village Harvest and shared results from a staff survey (grades 5-8) on the impact of the new electronics device rules. Dr. Glickman also shared that Mr. Scott Gaunky, Interim Director of Operations & Maintenance, successfully submitted the district for the Recovery of the Year Award, which will be presented to the district at the Midwest Facility Masters Conference.

### **CCSD 46 BOARD OF EDUCATION**

President Mack then requested a motion for the approval of the Consent Agenda, which includes Minutes from previous meetings, the Personnel Report, FOIA Review, Exception Report, and Accounts Payable Report. The motion carried.

**Action Items** voted on by the Board for this meeting included:

- Approval of the Contract with Premistar for Scheduled Service Support Approved: 4-0
- Approval of the Resolution of the Proposed 2024 Tentative Tax Levy and Schedule the Public Hearing on the 2024 Tax Levy and Issue a Notification to the Public Approved: 4-0

**Unfinished Business**, which are unresolved issues that were previously brought before the Board to be discussed further included:

 Sustainability Resolution
 Board Members Kristy Miller and Jessica Albert presented a revised draft of a Sustainability Resolution for Board consideration.

**New Business**, which are new issues for the Board to discuss, included the following:

- Press Plus Policy Updates 115 & 116
   The Board of Education reviewed proposed changes to many policies from Press Plus and discussed additional policy revisions as noted on the agenda.
- Revised Board Meeting Calendar
   A proposal to change the May 7th and May 21st Board of Education Meetings to one meeting on May 14th was suggested to allow the Board and Administration to attend the Lake County Regional Office of Education Educator of the Year Ceremony on May 7, 2024.

 Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement for Mutual Assistance in Response to Crises in the Public Schools of Lake County, Illinois
 The agreement establishes a collaborative approach among school districts and cooperatives in Lake County to provide mutual aid during crises. Lake County ROE will administer the agreement with the Regional Superintendent of Schools overseeing an Advisory Panel which will design and implement training programs to prepare school personnel for effective crisis response. This agreement will be an Action Item on the Board's November 6th agenda.

As the meeting drew to a close, topics for future agenda items were discussed, and the public once again had an opportunity to address the Board of Education. There were no public comments. The Board adjourned the general meeting at 7:48pm.
