CCSD 46 WELCOMES NEW ADMINISTRATORS

CCSD 46 is pleased to announce Ms. Amber Bowgren as the new Director of ML Services for the District, and Mr. Ryan Lazar as the new Assistant Principal at Frederick School. Both will be joining CCSD 46 in July.

Ms. Bowgren will be joining CCSD 46 from Harvard CUSD 50, where she has served as Bilingual and Dual Language Coordinator and the Director of Bilingual and Dual Language Programs for the past eight years. Prior to that, Ms. Bowgren served as an Assistant Principal, Dean of Students, and World Language Spanish Teacher at McHenry High School District 156. Ms. Bowgren is also an Adjunct Professor at Aurora University, where she teaches classes for the ESL endorsement. At the April 23rd Board of Education meeting, we offered our thanks and best wishes to two outgoing Board of Education members while also welcoming two newly elected members. Board President, Dr. Stephen Mack, and Board Member Mr. Jim Weidman were also sworn in for another four years of service to the CCSD 46 Board of Education.

We said goodbye to both **Jessica Albert**, member since her appointment to the Board in November 2021, and **Jason Lacroix**, member since his election in 2017. Midway through the meeting, both Board Members were acknowledged for their commitment to public education and the skills they each brought to their elected positions.





Following the adjournment *sine die*, the Board had a short recess for refreshments, and the newly elected Board Members took their Oath of Office and were seated.

We welcome **Mrs. Hillary Halverso**n and **Ms. Maureen Heun** to the Board of Education to serve four-year terms from 2025-2029.

Mrs. Hillary Halverson enjoys selfless service and hopes to both act as a liaison between the community & schools and to reinforce the progress of the district. She has served on two Lake County 501c3 boards in numerous roles including secretary and various chairs. She also founded and runs a writers' group designed to support local writers. She is a former Woodland Middle School art teacher and a prize-winning author. Mrs. Halverson holds a Bachelor of Arts in Art Education from the University of Illinois, with one semester from the Marchutz School of Arts in Aix-en-Provence, France, and earned a Master of Arts in Teaching and Leadership from St. Xavier University. TECHNOLOGY: END OF THE YEAR CHROMEBOOK COLLECTION

At the end of the school year, all student Chromebooks will be collected so that they can be cleaned and repaired. The technology team will have all devices ready for students on the first day of school in August.

We will not be collecting Chromebook chargers from each student. Parents and students should find a safe storage space for their chargers so they can be easily accessible for the start of school.

Students who are attending one of our summer school options will have a device issued to them for the duration of the program. Any families that feel they must have a Chromebook over the summer may sign one out from our technology department June 3 - 6, 8:00 am to 4:00 pm. The CCSD 46 Technology office is located at 450 N Barron Blvd. - in front of Grayslake Middle School. Please bring your student(s) with you since they will also need to sign the Chromebook Sign Out Form. Please note that current 8th-grade students and anyone else leaving the district are not eligible for a summer Chromebook.

SCHOOL REGISTRATION - ONGOING



As we head into spring, our buildings will soon begin to build classes for the 2025-2026 school year. This is one of the most important tasks to prepare for the upcoming school year. Our goal is to place students in the best possible setting for them to learn by building classes that are balanced in terms of learning needs and styles, gender, emotional and social development, academic achievement, and behavior. Therefore, it is important for us to have our new and returning students register for the 2025-2026 school year as early as possible.

Time is running out to take advantage of our \$25 "Early Bird Discount" for families that complete the online application process. Make sure to register and submit payment before the June 3rd deadline to take advantage of this savings.

Please be advised that for registration to be complete, the online application must be submitted with all necessary supporting documents, and a payment or payment plan must be received. Student schedules and transportation assignments will not be released in August until registration is complete.

GENERAL MEETING: April 23, 2025

The CCSD 46 Board of Education held a general meeting on Wednesday, April 23, 2025, in the Falcon Room of Frederick School.

President Stephen Mack called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm. Following the Pledge of Allegiance and the approval of the agenda, visitors to the meeting are invited to address the board for the first of two public comment opportunities. No comments were made.





The meeting began with a presentation by the Park Campus Leader of the Pack. Led by Jenn Voss, Dean of Students at Park Campus, this student group consists of seventh and eighth grade students who work together to support school activities, build a strong sense of community, and foster a positive learning environment. During their presentation, the students highlighted their accomplishments throughout the year and shared upcoming plans for the program. They also shared the results of a recent survey of eighth grade students to learn more about what the students enjoy most at school. The students shared that ELA (English Language Arts) and math emerged as the favorite subjects. Students had fun making helmets in science lab, volleyball was the top pick in PE class, and music was the most loved encore class. The Leader of the Pack members have taken on greater leadership roles this year, advocating for both the concerns and celebrations at Park Campus. They collaborate closely with staff members to help make Park Campus an even better place to learn and grow.

Following the presentation, President Mack requested a motion to suspend Robert's Rules of Order for the meeting in order for the Board and audience to participate in a sustainability activity to offer feedback on how circular economy is present in our community and its impact on students and staff.

Once the official meeting reconviened, Board reports were presented as well as the Superintendent report, and Student Representative reports. The Board of Education extended warm wishes for a Happy Administrative Professionals Day to Sue Walker and all of the administrative professionals across the district. They expressed their heartfelt appreciation for the dedication, hard work, and invaluable support these professionals provide each day.

Dr. Mack shared that he attended the inaugural track and field meet between Grayslake Middle School and Park Campus held on May 17th at Grayslake North High School.



Student Representatives Jessica German and Julia League shared highlights of the end-of-the-year activities at Park Campus. Kindergarten-4th grade events included an Earth Day book swap, gardening, and lessons on animal senses. In 5th-8th grade, students are participating in a wax museum and interactive science labs, as well as reading *Flowers for Algernon*.

Mrs. Jessica Albert wished everyone a happy, belated Earth Day.

Mrs. Tamika Nash shared that planning is underway for the Juneteenth celebration, scheduled for June 19th from 5:00-7:00pm.

Mrs. Kristy Braden invited everyone to join her in marching in the Pride Parade on June 8th at 12:00pm.

Mr. Jim Weidman shared that the Historical Society will dedicate a plaque on Saturday, April 26 at 9:00am in memory of four village employees who lost their lives in the line of duty in 1974. The dedication will take place across from the Village Hall.

During the Superintendent's Report, Dr. Lynn Glickman welcomed students from Grayslake Central High School and expressed her appreciation for their presence. She extended a heartfelt thank you to Sue Walker and all of the administrative professionals across the district for their dedication and invaluable contributions.

Dr. Glickman shared that the Science Olympiad season has concluded and celebrated students' achievements in several categories including Towers, Anatomy and Physiology, Crime Busters, Air Trajectory, Write It Do It, Entomology, and Microbe Mission. She also announced that BarnFest will be held on Saturday, April 26th, from 6:00-10:00 at Jesse Oaks Barn.

In closing, Dr. Glickman offered sincere thanks to the outgoing Board members. She acknowledged Jessica Albert for bringing deep thought and analysis to Board discussions, asking insightful questions, and approaching every topic with a fresh perspective and great empathy for others. She recognized Jason Lacroix for his exceptional listening skills and his unique ability to pose questions that bring clarity to discussions.

Dr. Chris Wolk, Director of Human Resources, provided a brief staffing update, noting that he has been closely monitoring student enrollment. He announced that both Avon and Park Campus will be adding a new section of 2nd grade for the 2025-2026 school year.

Ms. Amanda Pelsor, Director of Innovation, shared that student Chromebooks will be collected during the last week of school to allow for cleaning and repairs over the summer. Families may request a loaner device for use over the summer.

President Mack then requested a motion for the approval of the Consent Agenda, which includes Minutes from previous meetings, the Personnel Report, FOIA Review, Exception Report, Accounts Payable Report, Treasurer's Report, and Property Disposal Report. The motion carried.

Each Board member took a moment to personally thank outgoing members Jessica Albert and Jason Lacroix for their dedication, service, and commitment to Community Consolidated School District 46.

This Board, having no further business, adjourned sine die for a short recess before the Oath of Office was administered to the newly elected members. Kristy Braden administered the Oath of Office for Hillary Halverson, Maureen Heun, Stephen Mack, and Jim Weidman. Following the Oath, the members voted for Tamika Nash to serve as President Pro Tem during the board reorganization. Mrs. Nash called the meeting to order, and nominations were approved for Dr. Stephen Mack as Board President, Ms. Kristy Braden as Board Vice-President, and Mrs. Tamika Nash as Board Secretary. All motions carried unanimously.

Unfinished Business, which are unresolved issues that were previously brought before the Board to be discussed further, included:

New Business, which are new issues for the Board to discuss, included the following:

- Board Meeting Calendar for 2025-2026
 The Board of Education reviewed the proposed meeting dates for the 2025-2026 school year. The Board plans to hold two meetings per month in September, November, January, February, April, and June, and one meeting per month in July, August, October, December, March, and May. The calendar was thoughtfully planned to avoid conflicts with major religious holidays. The Board is scheduled to approve the meeting calendar at its May 14 meeting.
- Food Service Contract with OrganicLife Foodservice At the March 20, 2024, Regular Board meeting, the Board of Education awarded a contract to OrganicLife, LLC to serve as the district's Food Service Management Company (FSMC) for the 2024–2025 school year. At the March 19, 2025, Board meeting, representatives from OrganicLife provided a Food Service Update, which included an overview of the school year's start, student nutrition, and survey results. They also reported a significant increase in meal participation, approximately 11,000 more meals served from August 2024 through February 2025 compared to the previous FSMC. As outlined in the original contract, annual rate adjustments for breakfast and lunch meals follow the Consumer Price Index for "Food Away from Home," which increased by 3.6% over the past year. The administration is recommending renewal of the contract with OrganicLife for the 2025–2026 school year.

Board member Mr. Jim Weidman asked whether there have been any changes to reimbursements from the State of Illinois or the federal government.

Board member Mrs. Kristy Miller inquired if the Resource Conservation Committee could work with OrganicLife to provide triple Bottom Line measures that help the district reduce waste.







As the meeting drew to a close, topics for future agenda items were discussed, and the public once again had an opportunity to address the Board of Education. No comments were made during public comment. The Board adjourned the general meeting at 7:52 pm and entered into closed session.
