Dear Wildwood Residents,

As the weather warms and the days grow longer, Wildwood's 11 beautiful parks spanning 27.22 acres come to life with summer fun. Playgrounds, beaches, walking paths, pavilions, and Gages Lake and Valley Lake fill with Wildwood residents enjoying boating, fishing, swimming, walking, picnics, private parties, and more! As we enter this sunny season, I am excited to share all the new and exciting programs, events, news, and projects we have planned to make this an enjoyable summer for all!



Based on resident feedback, we are pleased to expand our programming with the introduction of CPR/AED certification and training programs. Multiple class options are available for adults, teens, babysitters, and caregivers, and include infant, child, and adult CPR, AED, and First Aid. We're excited to continue offering popular tot and youth programs like Summer Camps, Swim Lessons, Intro to T-Ball, Tot Soccer, and STEM programs led by the Warren-Newport Public Library. Join us for familiar summer events such as Movie in the Park featuring Mufasa on June 6th, Blues Soiree on June 20th, Family Campout on July 18th-19th, Adult Bingo Nights in the Park, and our popular six-part Summer Concert Series that runs June - August.

Several new and continuing Parks Maintenance initiatives include restoration of sitting benches, addition of an accessible crushed stone path connecting the Sunset Park parking lot to the playground and pavilion, restoration of baseball backstops at Willow Point and Twin Lakes Parks, repairs to Rule Park fishing gazebo, and in-house completion of the Pebble Beach Park shoreline stabilization project with the addition of native plants. Strategic initiatives are also being developed to address water quality in both Gages and Valley Lakes. General Information

BOAT RAMP KEYS

Annual boat ramp keys for 2025 went on sale January 2nd. Boat ramp keys open the launches at Pebble Beach and Sunset Park. To purchase a key, residents must present a current DNR boat registration for each boat/water craft that are listed in the resident's name, and Wildwood address. Along with your boat ramp key, you will receive one boat decal. You may purchase additional decals for \$10.00 each. Decals are required for any motorized water craft. Boat ramp keys are \$100.00, or \$75.00 for seniors 65+ and current/former military personnel.

DOGS IN THE PARKS

Friendly dogs are welcome in the Wildwood Park District parks. Please be reminded that dogs must always be leashed and controlled by their owners, and owners must clean up after their dogs. Dog Mutt Mitts are available in most parks. Dogs are not permitted in beach swim areas per Lake County Health Department.

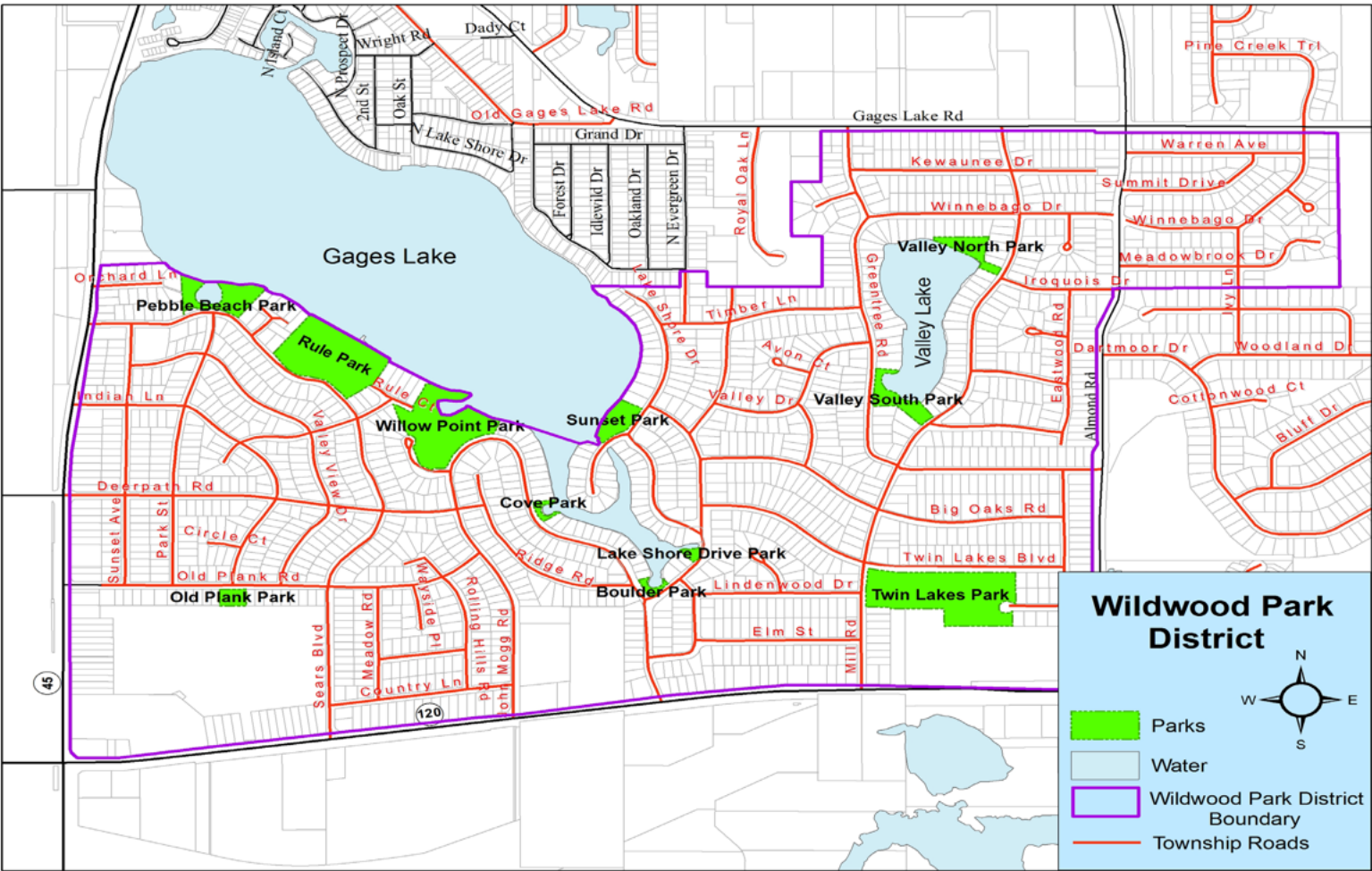

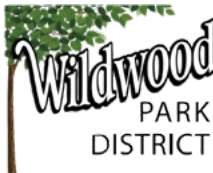

COMMUNITY NEEDS ASSESSMENT REPORT NOW AVAILABLE

Overview

In the winter of 2023, the Wildwood Park District conducted a comprehensive Community Needs Assessment Survey to gain insight into the needs within our community, strengths and areas of improvement of the Park District, and otherwise gather ideas, interests, and opinions from our residents.

Purpose

The purpose of this community study was to obtain input from Wildwood residents on all areas of WPD operations including use, condition, evaluation, and open feedback of: 1) WPD Parks and Facilities; 2) Maintenance; 3) Park Safety; 4) Programs and Special Events; 5) Administration and Customer Service; 6) Marketing and Communications; 7) Schoolhouse Adventures Community Preschool; and 8) Board of Commissioners. Furthermore, the Community Needs Assessment Survey serves multiple purposes, such as: 1) allows tax-paying residents the opportunity to voice their opinions related to future services and desired amenities; 2) survey results may also be used to identify and clarify concerns and assist leadership in decision making and financial resource allocation; 3) provides data and feedback that allows the WPD to build upon existing continuous improvement initiatives; and 4) helps the WPD set achievable and practical goals for the future.

Methods

The 91-question survey link was emailed to a database of 502 WPD residents. Analytics indicated 56% (208 residents) opened the email and 11% (55 residents) clicked on the survey link. In addition, the survey and link was promoted on the WPD website, numerous social media platforms and pages, and a hard copy was available at the WPD guest services front desk. Data collection took place from December 15th through January 31st. A total of 134 survey responses were collected.

Goals

The WPD established multiple goals from the Community Needs Assessment Survey: 1) understand overall satisfaction with existing parks, facilities, programs, services, and operations; 2) assess residents' opinions regarding future parks, facilities, programs, services, and operations; and 3) utilize the results to make recommendations for improvements and to engage the WPD Board of Commissioners and staff in conversations concerning the future development of and planning for parks, facilities, programs, services, and operations.

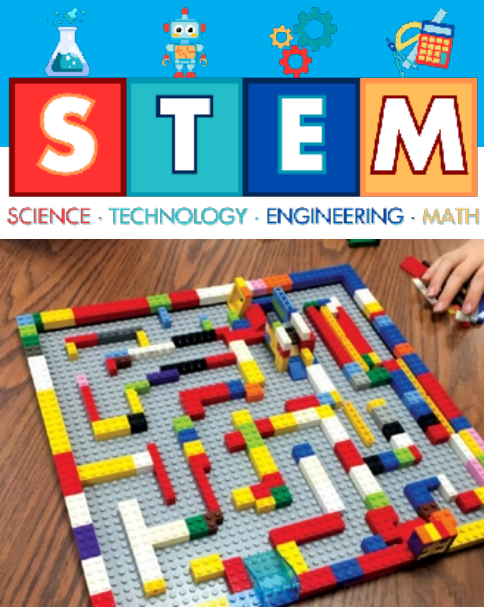

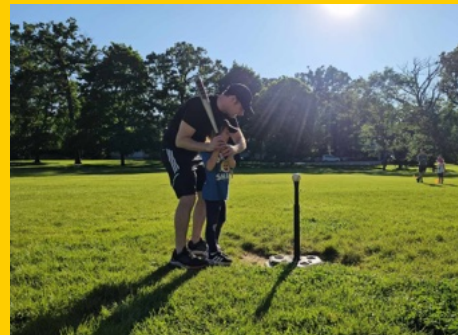
