| Presentation                   | Performance Services Solar Update- Mr. Kurt Hintz of Performance Services presented an update to the Board of Education on the recent performance report for the fiscal year July 1, 2024–June 30, 2025. The report summarized the district's energy savings and financial benefits. In spring 2019, Performance Services, Inc. (PSI) completed the installation of four large-scale solar photovoltaic systems at CCSD 46. These  |

included ground-mounted systems at Frederick and Prairieview, and roof-mounted systems at Park Campus and Grayslake Middle School. Solar metering equipment to monitor system energy generation was activated in May 2019. For this fiscal year, the district saw a reduction of \$222,411 in electric utility costs, with the solar systems producing 1,894,110 kWh, 69% of the projected production. This was due to issues with the inverter at Prairieview, which caused the system to malfunction. However, the inverter has since been repaired and the cost of a new inverter will be covered under the warranty. The full presentation is included in the Board packet.

## Board Member Reports

The Board of Education extended a warm welcome to everyone as they begin a new school year.

Dr. Stephen Mack shared that he attended the all-staff meeting held on Tuesday, August 12th, at Park Campus.

## Superintendent Report

Dr. Lynn Glickman shared that today was the first day of school. The week began with two Institute Days: on Monday, staff participated in meetings at their buildings and welcomed students for School Supply Drop Off; on Tuesday, the all-staff meeting featured keynote speaker Robert Hinchliffe. Dr. Glickman thanked Dr. Mack for welcoming staff at the all-staff institute. The afternoon included breakout sessions, with professional development on the new math resources. Dr. Glickman spent the afternoon with Amber Bowgren, the new Director of Multilingual, and her team.

Mrs. Amy Gluck, Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum, reported on last week's New Staff Orientation, where the district welcomed 40 new certified staff members for a three-day training. She expressed her appreciation to Jamie Parker, Teacher on Special Assignment (TOSA), along with the Instructional Coaches and Mentors, for helping make the orientation a success.

Dr. Chris Wolk, Director of Human Resources, announced that the district will begin a new superintendent search in anticipation of Dr. Glickman's retirement at the end of the 2025–26 school year. BWP Consulting Firm will lead the search, starting with focus groups on Thursday, September 4. Staff are invited to attend at 3:45 p.m., followed by a community focus group at 6:30 p.m., both in the Falcon Room at Frederick School. On September 8, a survey will be distributed to staff and families.

| Unfinished Business | Funding Update- Mr. Chris Wildman reported that FY25 federal Title funds have begun to be released. CCSD 46 remains a Tier 1 district at 72% adequacy, with \$38.9M in resources against a \$54.4M target. The district will receive \$1.15M in Tier funding, bringing total state contributions to \$21.5M—about \$450K less than budgeted. The decrease in Tier funding is primarily due to Chicago Public Schools returning to Tier 1 status. In addition,   |

|                                   | Senate Bill 3606 equalizes state reimbursement rates for public and private therapeutic day school placements for special education. While this increases funding fairness, it does not add new state dollars. As a result, the district's revenue projections were overstated by approximately \$800K.   |  |
